We identified a potential impact of this application, consequently we have consulted the detailed information contained on your website.

Information in the Historic Environment Record curated by this Trust shows that there is evidence of archaeological activity in the area, primarily dating to the prehistoric and Roman periods and including the Roman settlement at Pop Hill. Peat deposits have also been identified that potentially contain important paleoenvironmental data. In this case, it is our opinion that as the area has been disturbed due to its current use, it is unlikely that archaeological remains would be encountered during the work. The record is not definitive, however, and archaeological material may be disturbed during the course of the work. In this event, please contact this Division of this Trust. Nevertheless, as the archaeological advisers to your Members, we have no objection to the determination of this application.
