



Residential housing, associated gardens, recreational spaces and industrial estates dominate the landscape broadly to the north

Ely Distribution Centre (Industrial Estate) forms a prominent built element on the fringes of Cardiff adjacent to the A4232

The busy A4232, largely in cutting, with associated well-vegetated verges, creates a distinctive barrier between the urban dominated landscape to the north and the proposed restoration area to the south

The elevated Caerau Camp, although relatively well-vegetated, experiences occasional open views across the surrounding urban area, road corridor and undulating wooded ridges and farmland although there are extremely limited views of the proposed restoration area due to screening by intervening landform and vegetation

Existing access road is enclosed by mature vegetation which restricts its influence on the wider landscape

The proposed restoration area is well-enclosed broadly to the south by a combination of dense woodland vegetation and sloping landform

The proposed restoration area is well-enclosed by existing vegetation to the north, east, south and west, although its elevated and sloping location ensures that it is perceived from selected open and distant locations to the north, particularly during the winter months

The proposed restoration area consists of predominantly bare ground, earth banks, scree and rocky outcrops, largely enclosed by broad leaved woodland and scrub
