Transport Assessment Addendum – Swanbridge Road

June 2018 N02-MR-TAA

Introduction

- 1. Vectos is retained by Taylor Wimpey to provide traffic and transportation advice in relation to an outline application for the proposed development of up to 190 residential dwellings on land located to the west of Swanbridge Road, Sully.
- 2. The site is part of that allocated in the Vale of Glamorgan Local Development Plan 2011-2026 for residential development of up to 500 houses (Housing Allocation MG2 (25)), of which 350 have received a resolution to grant under application 2013/01279.
- This Transport Assessment Addendum technical note seeks to address matters previously 3. raised by the Vale of Glamorgan Highway officers in relation to the accessibility and connectivity of the land identified to accommodate up to 190 dwellings as shown in Figure 1 below.



Figure 1 - Site Location in a Local Context


Following submission of the application (Application No 2016/01520/OUT), the highway 4. authority had initially indicated that no highway objection was being raised based upon the proposed access arrangements from Cog Road and Swanbridge Road, the forecast impact on the local highway network based upon an increase in the number of residential units over and above that referenced for the allocated site, and the junction assessment at Cog Road/South Road. However, as part of the ongoing post-submission discussions, the highway officer raised concerns over the lack of pedestrian and cycle infrastructure to the east of the site and thus poor connectivity to South Road and the local bus stops.

- 5. Email correspondence dated 15th January 2018 advised that the application must provide a suitable pedestrian and cycle link that accords with the principles and guidance of the Activer Travel (Wales) Act and acknowledges the details included on the Vale of Glamorgan Active Travel Route plans that were approved by the Vale of Glamorgan Council's cabinet on 6th November 2017.
- 6. The Vale of Glamorgan Active Travel Route plans are included in **Appendix A**.
- 7. As detailed in the council's correspondence (and highway authority comments), whilst pedestrian routes exist to the west of the site which provide convenient and direct links to neighbouring areas, the local shop, primary school and sports pitches on or south of South Road, the highway officer is of the view that the routes do not meet the Active Travel (Wales) Act standards for shared pedestrian and cycle facilities.
- 8. As such, the highway authority insisted that a shared route is provided along Swanbridge Road between the eastern access on Swanbridge Road to a point north of the disused railway bridge that passes over Swanbridge Road.
- 9. At a meeting held on 27th February 2018 with officers from the Vale of Glamorgan Council, pedestrian connectivity between the site and South Road was discussed in detail. It was agreed that the developer would investigate the ability to accommodate a shared route along the western edge of Swanbridge Road. Two options were discussed at the meeting as set out below:
 - Retain the existing hedgerow and provide a shared route on the western side of the hedgerow;
 - Remove and reposition the hedgerow to enable a shared route to be provided alongside the existing carriageway.

Proposed Shared Use Link on Swanbridge Road

- 10. The highway authority has confirmed that in order to accord with the approved Active Travel Route plan for Sully, a 3m wide shared cycleway/footway is to be provided between the proposed site access on Swanbridge Road and the disused railway bridge to the south of the site that passes over Swanbridge Road.
- 11. Drawing No W120604A/A/02 Rev B provides details of the proposed link. The 3m shared us path will include a 500mm margin strip and will be located on the western side of Swanbridge Road.
- 12. Drawing No W120604A/A/02 Rev B is included in **Appendix B**.

13. The Vale of Glamorgan Council have confirmed that the remaining section of the route between the disused railway line bridge and South Road will be developed and implemented with Sustrans. Whilst there are currently no formal pedestrian footways along the southern section of Swanbridge Road, the council have advised that sufficient width is available to accommodate a shared use path on the western side and maintain access to the existing properties. The current highway layout is shown in Figure 2 below.





14. The highway officer has confirmed that the overall carriageway width for this southern section is 9m (adopted highway width) which is sufficient to accommodate a 3m shared use path and a 6m wide two-way carriageway.

Summary

- 15. The previous planning application for residential development (up to 350 units) on land to the south of Cog Road, Sully was granted planning permission subject to planning conditions with access agreed by the Vale of Glamorgan Council.
- 16. Pedestrian connectivity and accessibility was agreed out the outline stage along with vehicular access details. There was no requirement to provide a pedestrian/cycle link along Swanbridge Road.
- 17. In considering this application (Application No 2016/01520/OUT), the Vale of Glamorgan raised concern that no formal pedestrian link was being provided to enable pedestrians from the development to gain access to South Road via Swanbridge Road.

- 18. Swanbridge Road in its current form offers no pedestrian footway either along the site frontage or to the south of the site from the disused railway line bridge to its junction with South Road.
- 19. Further to various email exchanges and a meeting held with the Vale of Glamorgan (Planning and Highway officers) on 27th February, 2018 it was agreed that a shared pedestrian and cycle link is to be provided along the western side of Swanbridge Road. The provision of a shared route accords with the Vale's aspirations to improve the local pedestrian and cycling environment as detailed in the Vale of Glamorgan Active Travel Route plans.
- 20. The 3.0m wide shared surface route will include a 0.5m margin strip and will run alongside the existing surfaced carriageway. In order to implement the shared route path, the existing hedgerow is to be relocated further west. The details of the shared cycleway/footway are included in drawing no. W120604A/A/02 Rev B.
- 21. This layout addresses the highway authorities concerns in relation to connectivity and accessibility to the east of the site. There are no other highway concerns that have been raised to date. Based upon the proposed shared route path and associated hedgerow relocation being acceptable, there is no reason to refuse this application on highway grounds.




