Following our conversation, based on the swept paths shown on drawing No. BARRY_01_DWG_01_20115 Rev C, it appears that HGV's will be required to use the weighbridge when entering and existing the site. As a result, those entering the site will be required to do so from the wrong side of the carriageway within the mouth of the access, which would lead to conflicts with those vehicles existing. Therefore, I would suggest that the weighbridge is relocated further into the site in order to reduce the risk of conflict at the access.
