As statutory consultee, we welcome the opportunity to comment on this SAB application for surface water drainage proposals at the above site address, in accordance with Schedule 3 of the Flood & Water Management Act 2010. Our comments are provided in response to the hierarchy (S1) and fixed standards (S2 – S6), as highlighted in the Welsh Government 'Statutory standards for sustainable drainage systems', and on the basis of information provided by the SAB application. Should the proposal alter during the course of the application process we kindly request that we are re-consulted and reserve the right to make new representation.

Standard S1 – Surface Water Runoff Destination

As a hierarchy standard, we acknowledge that S1 provides an assessment on the choice of runoff destination by way of 5 Levels with the most preferred level represented by Priority Level 1, and movement from Level 1 to lower levels determined by demonstration that the exception criteria apply. This standard highlights that discharges to sewerage systems must be limited where possible and that Priority Levels 4 and 5 should only be used in exceptional circumstances. Accordingly, we offer the following comments to each of the 5 Levels:

Priority Level 1: Collected for use

We acknowledge the applicant does not propose to utilise rainwater harvesting as a method of sustainable surface water disposal.



Priority Level 2: Infiltrated to Ground

The submitted application form and accompanying drawing indicates proposals to discharge surface water flows into a soakaway system. In principle we offer no objection subject to consultation with the Building Regulations Authority / Approved Building Inspector as the regulatory body.

Priority Level 3: Discharged to a Surface Water Body

We acknowledge that the application does not propose to discharge surface water flows into a surface water body.

Priority Level 4: Discharged to a Surface Water Sewer, Highway Drain, or another Drainage System

The submitted application form and accompanying drawing indicates proposals to discharge surface water flows into a private surface water sewer and in principle we offer no objection subject to consultation with the riparian owner of this drainage system.

Priority Level 5: Discharged to a Combined Sewer

We acknowledge that the application does not propose to discharge surface water flows into a combined sewer.

Having regard to our appraisal for each of the standards (S1 – S6), as highlighted in the Welsh Government 'Statutory standards for sustainable drainage systems', we offer no objection in principle to the SuDS proposals, on the basis of information provided by the SAB application. Accordingly, if you are minded to grant SAB Consent for this application, we would request that the following Condition(s) and Advisory Notes are included within the consent to ensure no detriment to existing residents or the environment and to Dwr Cymru Welsh Water's assets:

Condition

No surface water and/or land drainage shall be allowed to connect directly or indirectly with the public sewerage network.

Reason: To prevent hydraulic overloading of the public sewerage system, to protect the health and safety of existing residents and ensure no pollution of or detriment to the environment



Advisory Notes

Please note that this SAB consent relates solely to the approval of SuDS components. In order to establish whether the proposed development benefits from consent, the applicant is advised to refer to the planning permission granted as well as any conditions in reference to foul water drainage. In accordance with the Town & Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (Wales) (Amendment) Order 2016 Dwr Cymru Welsh Water is a statutory consultee to the planning process and will provide comments to any proposals for foul water drainage by response to a planning application consultation.

The applicant is also advised that some public sewers and lateral drains may not be recorded on our maps of public sewers because they were originally privately owned and were transferred into public ownership by nature of the Water Industry (Schemes for Adoption of Private Sewers) Regulations 2011. The presence of such assets may affect the proposal. In order to assist us in dealing with the proposal the applicant may contact Dwr Cymru Welsh Water. Under the Water Industry Act 1991 Dwr Cymru Welsh Water has rights of access to its apparatus at all times.

Our response is based on the information provided by your application. Should the proposal alter during the course of the application process we kindly request that we are re-consulted and reserve the right to make new representation.
